Fr. Tom Heron's Weekly Reflection

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord Jesus, Welcome!

I rejoice in your presence with the Saint Matthew faith worshiping community as we participate in the Divine Liturgy for Pentecost Sunday. We are blessed by your desire to give thanks to Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, both parishioners and guests. May you be renewed in mind, heart and spirit through the Word and Eucharist we share. Thanks for joining us!

Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11 Psalm 104 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 John 20:19-23

Pentecost! The word means "fiftieth." It was the 50th day after the Jewish Passover when, along with other things, the beginning of the wheat harvest was celebrated. It was the 50th day after Jesus rose from the dead that the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles. The beginning of the material harvest that the Jews celebrated became the spiritual harvest that the apostles began to reap on this day. The apostles, and the disciples who were with them, were filled with the power of God and sent forth to preach the good news to all the world.

Besides calling today the Feast of Pentecost, we could also call it the Feast of the Power of God. For it was the day the power of God entered the souls of the apostles enabling them to carry out the mission Jesus Christ had given them. They were to become actively engaged partners with Christ in His work of rescuing individual souls from ignorance and the effects of sin.

Our coming into this world was similar to a flashlight we buy in a store. What do you often find printed on the package? "Batteries not included!" So you have to buy batteries and insert them properly in the flashlight to make it work.

Similarly, when you were born, batteries were not included. Like the flashlight, you were created to give light to the world. Though you were put into the world to do your part in God's plan of salvation, you did not have the needed power to do that. The Power of God to live and spread the teachings of Christ was still lacking in you. Therefore, the Sacrament of Confirmation!

It was at your Confirmation that the coming of the Holy Spirit in all His fullness came into you, and made you ever ready and able to live your life in such a way as to be of maximum benefit to Christ in His work of saving souls. You were fully charged, and like the Energizer Bunny, you became equipped to light the way for others all the way to Christ. With the Holy Spirit in you, you can now go on, and on, and on, as another Christ, and in union with Christ, loving and forgiving and saving souls — not only your own but those of the many people who come into your life.


You came into the world without batteries, without the power of God. If you have been confirmed you now have those batteries. You have the full energy of God the Holy Spirit which makes it possible for you to live the life of Christ and do the work of God as God wants you to. The power is in you, the force is with you — as it was with the apostles on the first Pentecost and, thereafter, for the rest of their lives. One thing, of course, is still necessary.

As a flashlight needs to be switched "on" for the batteries within it to make it shine, we need to be switched "on" to the Holy Spirit who is in us so we can shine. But nobody can do that but we, ourselves. Not even God will do it without our permission. Of our own free will, we must want the connection between us and the Holy Spirit to be activated or it won't happen. "You are the light of the world," Jesus told the people in His sermon on the mount. "Your light must shine before men so that they may see goodness in your acts and give praise to your heavenly Father." (Mt 5:14)

We might not be able to demand the Holy Spirit to empower us whenever we give our permission, but the light of Christ will most certainly not shine through us unless we do. You don't have to consciously give that permission with every act you perform. You can do it when you wake up in the morning to cover the entire day. It could go something like this:

"Holy Spirit, my life is Yours today.
Direct my every thought and decision,
Be in my every action so that I can carry out well
the will of my Father in heaven."

This is Pentecost, this is the feast of the Power of God within us. Let us stay connected to the Spirit and help light the way for others through the confusion of the world — to Jesus Christ.
