


Acts of the Apostles 8:5 – 8, 14 – 17 First Letter of St. Peter 3:15 - 18 John 14:15 - 21



Passage of the Conscience Protection Act (CPA) continues to be a top legislative priority for the USCCB Committee for Pro Life Activities. It will write into permanent law the core policy of the Weldon Amendment, which protects those who decline to perform, pay for, refer for, or provide coverage for abortion. The National Committee for a Human Life Amendment (NCHLA) has an initiative called Human Life Action (HLA) that mobilizes grassroots support for the U.S. Bishops' pro-life legislative agenda. At present, the passage of the Conscience Protection Act of 2017 is the Pro-Life Committee's top legislative priority and a call to action has been issued. HLA is conducting a nationwide program called Take Action Sunday to engage the faithful and in proclaiming the Gospel of Life relative to the legislative process. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia will be participating in Take Action Sunday during the weekend of May 20-21, 2017. The goal of Take Action Sunday is straightforward. We hope to generate many grassroots messages from the Faithful to Congress urging support for the Conscience Protection Act. Fr. Tom Heron's Weekly Reflection

When you have surgery, proper medical procedure requires that you consult with many people. Physicians tell you why you need the surgery. Surgeons tell you what will be done. Nurses check your medical history and tell you what you may eat before the operation. Physical therapists tell you what sort of activity you will be able to pursue after the surgery and the exercises you must do to recover. And the financial and insurance representatives of the hospital make certain that someone is paying the bill! Each professional is a specialist who does one specific thing to take care of you. Specialization may seem very modern, but it has been with us for a long time.

In the first reading today from the Acts of the Apostles, we see the first specialists in the history of the church. The apostles wanted to see justice done in the distribution of food. They knew that Jesus had commanded them to bear witness to Him at His ascension, so they appointed seven men to serve the Greek-speaking members of the community. So "the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table." The apostles established two specialized ministries. They seemed to say, "We will pray and preach while these seven men will take care of works of justice and mercy."

Some believe Christians should be mostly concerned with prayer, and others believe it is just as important to care for the poor and the needy. Human beings tend to divide the world in two: on one side are the things of the spirit - prayers and Church, and on the other side are the things of the real world -food and shelter.

Even the apostles Thomas and Philip in today's Gospel appear confused about the physical and spiritual and they want Jesus to clearly spell out where He is going and how they can get there.

Jesus came, suffered and died, and then rose from the dead to show us that what looks like two worlds is really one. The Son of God united the world of the spirit and the world of flesh when He took flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary. He united the world of the spirit and the world of flesh and blood when He gave His flesh as real food and His blood as real drink. Jesus often used material images to teach us spiritual truths. He told His disciples: "In My Father's house there are many dwelling places." In fact, St. John's Gospel is filled with signs that Jesus worked in order to reveal His glory.

It would be much easier if all we had to do was pray. It would be much easier if all we had to do was to be nice to each other – those works of justice and mercy. If we are to be true to Jesus' message, it has to be both prayer and works. The praise of God is in feeding the hungry and offering prayers and supplication. The praise of God is in welcoming the stranger and not neglecting the Word. The praise of God is in clothing the naked and praying over them. For those who believe in Jesus will do greater deeds than He did, because Jesus intercedes for us.

Our hearts need not be troubled. When we go to the table of the Eucharist, we join together with Jesus in the greatest prayer of praise, and we are strengthened to go forth to do the works that Jesus did. He gives us Himself-Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity that we might continue to make Him visible in our world today.

Reflections from my rocking chair

Dear friends,

The month of May is traditionally accented by devotion to the Blessed Mother and in her in the enormous mission as the mother of Jesus. Her "fiat" (let it be done to me) is the perfect model of faith. She is, in a manner of speaking, the first Christian when the angel announces to her the mysterious transformation that is taking place in her womb. We ought not to confuse Mary's meekness for weakness or her humility for a lack of self-esteem. Devotion to Mary has one goal; to allow her to take us to Jesus and thus to enter into the love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Saint Louis de Montfort said of her, "He who finds Mary, finds life – that is, Jesus Christ, who is the way and the truth and the life."

In our life of prayer Mary is the great intercessor. She seeks to pray along with us and assist us in discovering the favor of God. Throughout the centuries, Mary's devotional titles illustrate the many ways in which she accompanies us on our journey. She is our Advocate, our Mediatrix, our Comforter of the Afflicted, Refuge of Sinners, Queen of All Saints, Queen of the Apostles, Queen of Martyrs, Queen of Peace, Our Mother of Sorrows, Our Lady of Mercy, Our Mother of Good Counsel, Our Lady of the Rosary and Mother of God. Throughout the centuries the church has embraced various apparitions and, in particular, Our Lady of Lourdes, Our Lady of Fatima and Our Lady of Guadalupe. There are others.

The spiritual life of the Blessed Mother is most vividly proclaimed in the Gospel of Luke (1:46 – 47ff). God has lifted up the lowly. He has filled her with joy. He has accomplished great things in her. He cast down the wicked from their thrones. He has filled the hungry with good things. He remembers his promise of mercy. We can have no better advocate on our behalf. Consider the wedding feast at Cana: Mary is concerned for the newlyweds who have run out of wine at the reception. She asked Jesus to remedy the embarrassment. Jesus tells her it is not his time for miracles. Yet, she tells the stewards to do whatever he says. He does what his mother tells him to do. Such an intercessor!

Carol Monaco, a spiritual writer devoted to Mary, writes, "When we devote ourselves to Mary, we commit ourselves to the Holy Trinity with faith, hope, and love. Like Mary, when we answer "yes" to God's call, we open the door to all that is good and true. Good works replace sinful acts, selflessness overcomes selfishness, and hope is given to the hopeless. Let there be no hesitation on our part. And as Mary said to her visionaries, do not be afraid."
