Sirach 3:17 – 18 Hebrews 12:18-19, 22 – 24 Luke 14:1, 7 – 14
Today Sirach counsels, conduct your affairs with humility... Humble yourself more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God." Fr. Tom Heron's Weekly Reflection

There's a story told about two elderly priests, both in advanced old age, who made an agreement. Whichever of them died first, he would return and tell the other what life beyond the grave was like.

Eventually one of them died. Some months later the other was sitting in his room preparing his homily for Mass on Sunday. He suddenly became aware of a presence and sure enough his priest friend who had just died was standing there before him.

"Well," he said to his friend, "tell me what it's like in heaven." His friend replied – "You'd be surprised who's there." There was a pause. "And you'd be surprised who isn't there." And, with that, he was gone.

In the Gospel we just heard, Jesus is on a preaching tour. Some of His listeners asked rather arrogantly whether very many people would be saved. The way they put it was "Lord will only a few be saved?"

In answering, Jesus told them that the real question was not "how many?" but "what kind?" Those will be saved who strive through the discipline of grace to enter through the narrow gate.

This answer must have brought the questioners down to earth. Jesus said, in effect, -- never mind the numbers game, your task is to work hard, to struggle so that you'll be able to enter by the narrow gate that leads to salvation.

There is no way through this narrow door without personal struggle and discipline.

Jesus is very clear. The smug will not enter the Kingdom of Heaven. The smug person is the one who is so sure of himself or herself that they have closed themselves off from the real truth.

In our own personal lives we become smug when we no longer value our spiritual lives. We'd rather live just on the surface of life. When we take care of business, make a good living, accumulate more than we need, pay undue attention to our physical grooming and no attention to our inner grooming – then we have decided to live shallow and superficial lives.

We don't get through the narrow gate if we neglect our deeper spiritual selves. It is so easy to become smug.

There *is* a danger we all have to avoid.

We think that we are attending to our spiritual lives because we come to Church each week, maybe each day. We keep all the rules.

The danger is that we can start thinking that since we are doing what good Catholic Christians are supposed to do, we are going through that narrow door easily, with little or no effort.

In our smugness we think life is easy, no challenges, no discipline necessary to meet all the obstacles life presents.

We live life based on our own rules; and totally neglect God's rules. It is to these that Jesus says: "I do not know you."

Now, almost everyone here has managed to practice some discipline – sometimes on our own initiative.

Sometimes at the urging of others.

And most of us have learned from experience that discipline is often

difficult.

For example, to learn to play a musical instrument requires discipline.

To go on a diet requires discipline.

To practice total abstinence from alcohol, smoking, drugs, requires discipline.

Coaches tell athletes that it is the disciplined team that outlasts all others.

The Epistle to the Hebrews we heard says bluntly that in the life of the soul discipline is difficult:

"Whom the Lord loves, He disciplines."

At the time it is administered, all discipline seems a cause, not for joy, but for pain. But as all good parents and coaches tell us, later it brings the peaceful fruit of strength to those who are trained by it.

The point Jesus is making is that the way to salvation isn't easy. There is no slipping through. It is not enough to belong to the "in" group and there is no way through the narrow door without personal struggle and discipline.

Many who come to Church and receive Communion could, without the discipline Jesus speaks about, find themselves saying with the group in the Gospel – "Lord, You know us, we ate and drank with You," only to hear: "I do not know you."

Weekly attendance at Mass and weekly reception of Holy Communion must never lull us into complacency. It would be presumptuous to think that we will reach heaven simply because we are Catholics, or simply because we are a priest, or a nun, or simply because we go to Communion each week.

It all helps, but it is no guarantee!

We shall reach heaven because of the gracious goodness and compassion of God, because of the sacrifice Jesus made for us, and because of our own humble efforts to live by Jesus' Law of Love.

Maybe we, too, will be surprised when we reach heaven by those who are there and by those who are not.

In the meantime, our task is not to waste time on pointless speculation about "how many" will be saved. What matters is that we strive to live out our faith in our daily lives, putting all our trust in God Who may discipline us – but only because His love is strong and His faithfulness lasts forever.

The smug person always looks for loopholes, side doors. There are none, says Jesus. Well, where is that narrow gate or door? "I am that door," says Jesus and until we can fit our lives into His, until we become like Him in doing justice and loving the sinner, and becoming holy like Him, we will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven.
